<p>Introductions Kim Naughton</p>	<p>Apex Leadership Co. Anna Marie from Apex Leadership Company came to speak and advertise her company. She is a new business owner that lives in Flemington. Apex is a company that specializes in fundraising. She says her company enables schools to achieve 50% more funds than product based fundraising. Her company offers a 2 week program at the school which instills positive messages and leadership skills to the students. The theme is “Game On.” The program has leadership lessons, anti bullying lessons, empowerment, and health and fitness lessons. Each day of the 2 week program a different activity occurs at the school. Every child receives a t-shirt, lanyard, and other swag. During a few of the days, collegiate athletes visit the school and engage with students. The end of the 2 week program culminates with a fun run in which kids obtain sponsorship from their family and friends to raise funds. -\$1500 paid to Apex up front to lock in the dates. She states that the following year, if our school does not wish to do the program again, we will be refunded the \$1500. -For all the money raised, Apex receives 48% of the profit and our school receives 53%.</p> <p>Introductions -Everyone introduced themselves and the grade and teacher of their child.</p>
<p>Principal Update Mr. Billy</p>	<p>-Flu is mostly gone from the school. Another case of strep today though. Continue to encourage your children to wash their hands etc.</p> <p>-MLK Day- The community service day was held the day after MLK day so all students could be involved. It went well. Students made over 200 bags of food for HomeFront and 150 for TASK. Cards and posters went out to a senior center and cards to Children’s Specialized Hospital.</p> <p>-Bonnie Watson Coleman visited the school. She is a local congresswoman and came to see the students and picked up Valentines letters to be delivered to veterans.</p>

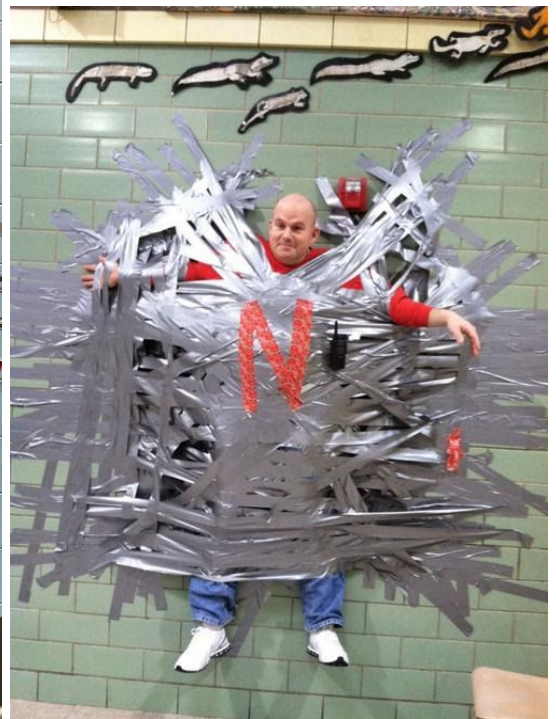

<p>PTO President's Update Kim Naughton</p>	<p>-Please recycle flyers/information at home. Sending it back to school is extra work for staff/admin to sort through.</p> <p>-Also, we understand and acknowledge not every fundraiser is a fit for every family. We just try to find an array of ideas that will benefit the school and the students.</p> <p>-PTO Facebook page v. Ben Franklin discussion page. Please note that the PTO is NOT in charge of the discussion page. If you have a PTO related question, please visit our PTO page. We don't get notifications from the Ben Franklin Discussion Page so please just use Ben Franklin PTO Page with questions about PTO related things. During the meeting, there was a brief discussion by some board members, the administrator of the Ben Franklin Discussion Page Facebook account, and the other parents/guardians in attendance regarding the confusion and it was suggested that maybe a clarification needs to be made as to the purpose of the pages or perhaps it should be consolidated into one page instead.</p> <p>-Our goal for the remainder of the year will be trying to only send online/email flyers that don't require anything being returned to the school for a chair. Flyers that require money/information will still be sent home as well as being able to be viewed online. Reducing the amount of flyers to only those events needing information returned back to the school or money sent in will help save the school money on paper and printer ink.</p> <p>-Review/explain changes to by-laws Typically bylaws are updated and reviewed every 6-8 years. It was time to go through them. PTO board sent email with the updates so will briefly explain changes:</p> <p><u>Articles 1, 2, 4:</u> Grammar corrections, fluency of language corrected <u>Article 3:</u> stating about membership and clarified who can be a PTO member and serve on the Executive Board and who can vote at PTO meetings</p>

<p>PTO President's Update cont.</p> <p>Kim Naughton</p>	<p><u>Article 5:</u> Officer enumerations and terms: board member typically spends 5x what we are asking board member candidates to have done prior to nomination. Being a board member is a heavy workload and it is all voluntary. A prospective board member must be ready to commit to the big responsibility and time commitment. Prospective board members need to be at PTO meetings, be at events, and chair events. It's a commitment and therefore it's important that bylaws clearly set out the mindset that is needed.</p> <p>-Term limit change: Addresses the issue of turnover. Typically most people get burnt out after 2 years. It is in the best interest of the PTO to have people that are willing to do it.</p> <p>-Nomination change: Corrected it for clarity and to ensure there are no surprises at the election PTO meeting. Under the old bylaws, it was possible for someone to come to the May PTO meeting that holds the elections and state they wish to run. This would result in other candidates to now make a speech on the spot which seemed unfair. It also would result in PTO members not at the election meeting to be unaware of additional candidates now running. Under the new bylaws, people can no longer come to the May meeting and say they now want to run. Nominations will be done during the prior meeting. Now everyone goes into May meeting knowing who the candidates are.</p> <p><u>Article 6-</u>clarify job duties for executive roles</p> <p><u>Article 7-</u> change check signing rules and changed to \$500</p> <p><u>Article 8-</u> committees now need to send updates to the executive board and send flyers to the executive board for approval before distributing flyers. Also erased the fundraisers because it changes yearly.</p> <p><u>Article 9-</u> took out that executive board members can meet and change bylaws on their own and now made it so the PTO members can vote on changes through majority vote at meeting. Currently the bylaws state that the board can change it without having a vote by PTO members. Wanted to make the change to be fair and transparent.</p> <p>-PTO President, Kim, answered questions posed by BF families regarding various changes made to bylaws. Questions arose as to why the requirements to be on the board were made more stringent and the explanation was that being a board member consumes a lot of time and the requirements listed are a fraction of what is actually expected from a board member. Questions were raised as to why an additional term was added and the explanation given was that people are typically done after 2 years, but for those individuals that are willing to keep going and doing it, they should be allowed to do so and to stay on and continue. Questions were raised as to elections and the answer given was that elections are held when a board member will not be at the school the following year (no longer has a child at the school), or if their 3 consecutive terms are up and need a reelection, or if a board member no longer wants to continue their position. It was reiterated that it is a 2 year term and with the proposed changes, the same board member can stay on for 2 more terms (6 years total) without the need for a reelection. It was stated that a board member does not have to stay on for 6 years and that the position remains a 2 year position, however if a board member wishes to stay on for 6 years they can.</p> <p>-following the lengthy discussion, a vote was conducted. There were 12 in favor of the proposed bylaws and 4 against the proposed bylaws. By a majority vote, the proposed bylaws were passed and are effective immediately.</p>
